Our pharmacy

The Department of Pharmacy operates 24 hours a day with about 30 professional and 25 supporting staff members. Our pharmacists serve as preceptors for several pharmacy schools in Ohio.

The clinical pharmacy department provides:

- Clinical pharmacy services in the emergency department
- Drug information
- Education to various health care professionals
- Formulary services and policy development
- Patient care rounding with multidisciplinary teams (family medicine, internal medicine and critical care)
- Pharmacokinetic and anticoagulant consultation services

Our residency program

The PGY1 Pharmacy Residency is a 12-month program with an emphasis in acute care and experiences in ambulatory care, practice management, drug policy and formulary management, hospital practice and academic development. In addition to the required residency rotations, the resident can tailor the program to his/her personal interests through a variety of elective opportunities. Consistent with other residency programs, the design and conduct of a major project and a pharmacy service component are required.

The strengths of our program include internal medicine, critical care, emergency medicine and the numerous opportunities available to participate in the education of pharmacy students, resident physicians and other health care professionals. Residents also participate in a longitudinal teaching certificate program (offered by the Northeast Ohio Medical University College of Pharmacy) that provides an opportunity to improve their didactic, small group and experiential teaching skills.

The residency program was established in 2004 and is accredited by the American Society of Health-System Pharmacists (ASHP).

Required learning experiences

One-month rotations:

- Advanced internal medicine (with pharmacy student preceptorship)
- Critical care (two months)
- Emergency medicine
- Internal medicine
- Practice management
- Transitions of care

Longitudinal rotations:

- Clinical services (consultation service)
- Hospital policy and formulary management
- Hospital practice
- Medication safety/management
- Residency project
- Teaching and education (including teaching certificate program)

Elective learning experiences

The resident may choose one physician co-precepted elective rotation. Flexibility exists to create additional electives based on resident interest. Up to one month of elective time may be used for research project implementation/completion, if necessary for the project and approved by the residency director.

Pharmacist precepted elective rotations:

- Anticoagulation clinic
- Family medicine
- Oncology
- Repeat a required one-month rotation (internal medicine, critical care, emergency medicine)

Pharmacist and Physician co-precepted elective rotations:

- Cardiology
- Geriatrics
- Infectious disease
- Nephrology
- Palliative Care
- Trauma service

Start date and benefits

- Residency start date: The last week of June, includes a one-week hospital orientation for new residents.
- Service requirement: Every other weekend.
 Includes clinical services and a pharmacy staffing component.
- **Stipend:** \$47,486
- Benefits: A comprehensive benefits package includes health care and prescription coverage, dental and vision coverage, life insurance, and optional participation in a 403b program. Eligibility for benefits starts July 1.
- Paid time off: Total of 15 days (sick, vacation and personal time)
- **Professional time off:** A minimum of 10 days
- **Holiday requirement:** Resident works only one holiday, receives six hospital-recognized holidays off with pay.
- Parking: Free, covered garage

How to apply

The Residency program attends both the Ohio Society of Health System Pharmacists (OSHP) and the American Society of Health System Pharmacists (ASHP) residency showcases each fall to meet with interested candidates and answer questions.

The application deadline is January 2.

- Candidates should submit the following using PhORCAS:
 - 1. Letter of intent (include current practice interests, why you are interested in pursuing a residency, and examples of what you hope to accomplish)
 - 2. Curriculum vitae
 - 3. Academic transcripts
 - 4. Three letters of recommendation (completed using the PhORCAS standardized reference form)
- Candidates must be eligible for Ohio licensure. Please note: We are not able to sponsor visas for pharmacy residents.
- After receiving and reviewing all application materials, individual candidates will be selected for onsite interviews at St. Elizabeth Youngstown Hospital in January and February.
- The Resident Matching Program Code Number is 186113.
