## Fellowship Spotlight: Bridging Clinical Insight and Administrative Leadership

As a practicing emergency physician at Mercy Health – St. Rita's Medical Center, I entered the Healthcare Administration, Leadership, and Management (HALM) fellowship with a desire to expand my impact beyond the bedside. What I found was a transformational exposure. It is an experience that has challenged my assumptions, stretched my understanding of healthcare systems, and reshaped the way I view leadership.

Transitioning from clinical care to system-level decision-making was not easy. I was quickly immersed in a world of finance, governance, and strategic operations. These domains are rarely addressed in formal medical training. Early meetings often felt like decoding a foreign language.
